


# Lower Satsop Floodplain Reconnection and Overflow Channel

Goal #2: Improve floodplain connectivity and restore side-channel and off-channel habitats


Goal #3: Lower flood elevations in the project area




### **Current Status:**

Channel migrating at a rate of 40-80 ft/year

Loss of prime agricultural land alarming to landowners (channel migration reduced due to Keys Rd)

Dikes and 160,000 cy spoils in floodplain at abandoned gravel pit are impacting natural channel processes, flood storage and habitat diversity

Assessment and Design:


Hydraulic modeling, alternatives analysis and preliminary design complete Developing final designs-complete June 2017

#### **Existing Funds:**

-Authority funded preliminary design

-Chehalis Restoration and Protection grant funded final design

-Received funding from Authority and DOE to construct overflow channel







Permitting:


-Submit JARPA December 2016 -Ongoing discussions with ACOE and DOE regarding wetland mitigation
