SUBJECT: Update on 2021-23 Local Projects Review Process

Purpose of this memo is to update Flood Authority members on the status of the 2021-23 local projects review process. We will discuss this at tomorrow's 9-17-2020 Flood Authority meeting. Please feel free to call or email with questions (360/480-6600, <u>scottb@sbgh-partners.com</u>).

## A. Background

Flood Authority is currently engaged in another round (5<sup>th</sup> round) of soliciting, reviewing, ranking, and submitting for funding consideration local project proposals to provide localized flood relief across the Basin. The Flood Authority's Local Projects Reviewers Group has met twice. First meeting (8-13-2020) was for orientation and identification of additional information needs. Second meeting (9-15-2020) was to review scoring and discuss initial ranking and organization.

At the Flood Authority's 11-19-2020 meeting the Flood Authority will discuss and approve a final funding proposal for consideration by the Chehalis Basin Board at their 12-03-2020 meeting.

## B. Review and Ranking Process and Considerations


Key considerations discussed through the Local Project Reviewers Group include:

- 1. Is the project tied to local stormwater runoff or Chehalis Basin flooding?
- 2. Is the project maintenance or capital improvement (thus Capital Budget eligible)?
- 3. Was the application sufficiently completed considerate of Sponsor's capacity, knowledge, staffing?
- 4. Does the project have stand-alone benefit or delayed benefit until such time as another project or phase is completed?
- 5. Are projects distributed throughout Basin?
- 6. Does total funding level conform with past appropriations?
  - 2012 -- \$5.0M
  - 2013-15 -- \$10.74M
  - 2015-17 -- \$15.71M
  - 2017-19 -- \$9.6M
  - 2019-21 -- \$3.6M
