6. Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) 2015-2017 Budget Update

Hand out provided. Phil provided an update on the 2015-2017 UPWP budget. A brief status update on each line item was provided (please refer to handout for specifics). There is anticipation that the remaining balance will be approximately \$12,000.00. Phil explained that these monies are at risk of losing and going back to the state. There was a brief discussion about possibly looking into spending the remaining \$12,000 on pedestrian/trail counters. There was enough interest and feedback from members.

ACTION: Approved any identified budget changes and to authorize pedestrian and trail counters with the remaining UPWP funds. Cindy Carter moved to approve; Dale Pomeroy second, approved unanimously.

<u>Action: Motion to approve WSDOT financial agreement by Todd O'brien; Second Deric</u> <u>Mayo: motion passed unanimously.</u>

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7. HSTP Grant Funding

Tom Hansen – Present info on the Grant Funding Available for the required QUADCO HSTP Update in 2018.

<u>Action Requested</u>: For information only.

Tom presented information stating that every project was funded at 100%. The HSTP has already allocated \$80,000 for the next cycle. There is a change in the HSTP procedure adding community engagement at the front end of the process. Ideally they would like to see the plan finished by July/August 2018 to have the project list approved by December 2018. This will allow grantees to put in applications for the 2019-2021 cycle.

8. HSTP Planning Activities Update

Jan Ollivier Provided an update on the HSTP Planning Activities and Consolidated Grant Project Process status.

9. SFY 2018-2019 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Selection of Planning Projects

Handout was provided. There were 5 applications received during the call. Lincoln County, City of Ellensburg, City of Davenport, City of Roslyn, and the Town of Odessa. All 5 applications were reviewed by WSDOT. Representatives of each project provided a brief description about their proposed plans. Jeff Tincher explained that the 5 projects were estimated at \$165,000 for funding. All combined request received for the project funding was a total of \$114,000.00. Leaving a remaining fund of \$50,000, the selection committee has 2 options. Option 1- Agencies match equals \$48,000. We can reimburse members match portion that will then take up the majority of the funding budgeted.

Option 2- Do a call a year from now for additional projects.

-There were a few discussions about the options.

<u>Action Requested:</u> Approve funding of selected projects for the SFY 2017-2019 Biennium.

<u>ACTION:</u> Motion by Luke Huck; to approve funding of the projects as selected and supplement agencies match (option 1) with remaining fund balance. Approve the 2017-2019 budget. Second; by Steve Goemmel. Passed unanimously.
