## Walla Walla Partnership

SHB 1013, 2SSB 5352

- Extends the Walla Walla Pilot Water Management program through June 30, 2021.
- During the "transition period", the following must occur:
  - Performance and financial audits;
  - Continuation of the Walla Walla basin flow enhancement study;
  - Development of a 30 year integrated water resource management strategic plan;
  - Report to the legislature (due Nov 30, 2020).

# **Drought Preparedness and Response**

SHB 1622



Modernizing our drought statutes to effectively prepare for and respond to drought emergencies.

# Drought – Streamlining our Response

Communication: Authorizes Ecology to issue a "drought advisory" warning.

• Removes the requirement to publish notice of a drought emergency in local newspapers.

Funding: Removes outdated financial accounts and updates current ones.

• Updates the emergency grant program to reflect current practices (addresses flexibility for projects, cash match, eligible entities, and loans).

<u>Emergency permits:</u> Authorizes Ecology to recover the costs of mitigation obtained for emergency water right permits.

<u>Contingency planning:</u> Authorizes Ecology to engage in planning outside of a drought emergency.

# **Drought** – Building Resiliency

Preparedness projects:
Authorizes Ecology to fund drought projects outside of a drought emergency.

Long-term water right leases: Establishes a pilot program to investigate the use of long-term water right leases as a drought preparedness strategy.
