







Statewide Precipitation Anomalies



Transition in precipitation anomalies ECOLOGY October – February to March - August






Oct – Feb: 45th Wettest Statewide since 1895 Wettest since 1999




April Snowpack and Forecasted Seasonal Runoff





Forecasted April – September Runoff (percent of normal)



Mid-May Streamflow Forecasts










Flat-lining of Precipitation Yakima Airport Station









Accumulated Precipitation - NORTHPORT, WA
















Precipitation Required to End the Drought,
