The East Fork Lewis River Water Quality Public Town Hall was hosted on June 3, 2019, in the City of La Center. Fifty-four people attended this important Town Hall meeting including forty members of the public, and fourteen people from environmental organizations.

share information about local environmental programs, projects, and priorities; provide landowners with resources to improve water quality on private property; and answer questions.

of 2018 to work collaboratively with
stakeholders to develop and implement a
Water Cleanup Plan for the East Fork
Lewis River watershed, to address
challenges with fecal coliform bacteria and
