Background

The East Fork Lewis River and its tributaries are on the state's <u>polluted</u> <u>waters list</u> for warm water temperatures and fecal coliform bacteria problems, which drives the need to develop a <u>Water Cleanup Plan</u>.

Keeping the watershed clean is important for public and environmental health.

The East Fork Lewis River Bacteria and Temperature Source Assessment Report initiated the water cleanup process by studying the watershed and identifying the most important areas for water quality projects.

Cleanup efforts are supported by the <u>East Fork Lewis River Partnership</u>, which is a collaboration of local, state, tribal, and federal governments; non-profits; watershed groups; private industry; and landowners that are working together to benefit water quality.

Multiple East Fork Lewis River partners will attend this public town hall to answer questions, share information, and resources.
