




La Center Wetlands Sites 1 and 2

Floodplain revegetation 45 acres












East Fork (Ph 2)- Side Channel





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East Fork (Ph 3)- Ridgefield Pits

- Limiting factors: channel confinement, disconnected floodplains, sediment, temperature predation
- Benefits: salmonids (adults/juveniles), lamprey, restore native vegetation
- Proposed Actions:
 - o Site 1- reconnect and improve habitat along 1.5 mi. of the East Fork, including 20 acres at the pits
 - o <u>Site 2</u> restore connectivity and improve habitat conditions along 2 side-channels (3,500 ft.)
- Community Based Restoration: work with partners & Technical Oversight Group

Area 1 Potential Solution: Reconnect East Fork (diff. options) along 3,500 feet + habitat features.



Area 2 Potential Solution: Reconnect side-channels, regrade pit + habitat features.
