- East Fork Lewis River Partners were welcomed to the kickoff meeting by La Center's Mayor Greg Thornton, and Wastewater Treatment Plant Supervisor, Matthew Jenkins.
- Following the welcome, a <u>presentation</u> on the partnership, and the process to develop a Water Cleanup Plan for the East Fork Lewis River was presented by Devan Rostorfer, TMDL Lead from Washington State Department of Ecology.
- A presentation on the <u>East Fork Lewis River Watershed Bacteria and Temperature Source</u>
 <u>Assessment</u>, was also provided by Sheelagh McCarthy, from Ecology's Environmental
 Assessment Program.
- Some projects in the East Fork Lewis River were highlighted by Implementation Partners.
