


Tools for focusing, integrating and coordinating efforts


Purpose

- Identify strategic priorities
 Policy, management, funding, outcomes
- Improve management
 Align local & regional efforts (programs & actions)
- <u>Identify priority pressures</u> affecting the Vital Sign(s) and <u>key</u>
 <u>barriers</u> to achieving recovery
- Address key uncertainties impeding recovery: Align & prioritize monitoring, assessment, and research
- <u>Identify intermediate outcomes</u> and <u>measures of progress</u>
- Estimate costs of achieving the recovery target
- <u>Identify who</u> is responsible for all steps of management and implementation









MWQ – Dissolved Oxygen Implementation Strategy

Strategic priorities for reducing stressors and improving DO

Addresses all factors affecting dissolved oxygen, including nutrient reduction

Addresses multi-benefits and/or trade-offs for other Vital Signs, common threats, barriers, strategies

Nutrient Reduction Strategy

Highest priority nutrient reduction strategies

Strategic priorities for reducing nutrient inputs

More detailed focus on nutrient reduction strategies than IS
