**Incident Summary:** On Thursday, January 23rd 2020, the tug Pacific Falcon was moored

starboard side to Pier 15, Maxum Enterprises LLC's Harbor Island facility dock in Seattle, WA. The vessel was loading a planned 66,500 gallons of Low Sulfur Diesel Fuel and 300 gallons of lube oil. During the

diesel fuel transfer, a valve was left open on the No. 7 fuel tank,

overfilling the tank as the transfer continued. Diesel fuel spilled from the fuel tank vent, onto the deck, and overboard into Elliott Bay. The Maxum terminal initiated emergency shutdown procedures, and staffed deployed sorbent pads to soak up the spill. Global Diving and Salvage continued the cleanup operations, and recovered approximately 86 gallons of diesel fuel spilled from the deck, and 62 gallons from the water. Evaporation of on water diesel fuel was conservatively estimated at 8 gallons, bringing

the total spill to water volume to 70 gallons.
