Chapter 173-224 WAC Update

Why

Ecology updates every two years to fund permit program and make needed changes

What

- Maintain fees at Fiscal Year 2021 rates
- New structure for Vessel Deconstruction GP to support its use
- New category for a new permit type: PS Nutrients GP
- Technical changes for clarity and transparency

When

- Public Comment period started March 16 through May 4
- Public hearing webinar April 27 10:00 a.m.

- Rule adoption early June
- Effective July 2021 for Fiscal Year 2022 invoicing



101 to 401s

- What are 401 water quality certifications for NPDES permits?
 - Generally, Ecology certifies federal permits/licenses that may allow a discharge of pollutants that originates in our state (to waters of the US).
 - Certification approval or approval with condition(s) = we think that the permit will meet Washington's WQ standards.





101 to 401s

- Why do we certify EPA's permits?
 - Ecology writes all NPDES permits except for those on federal or tribal land.
 - Our role is to ensure EPA's permits meet State WQ standards.
 - If we don't think EPA's permits will meet State WQ standards, we write WQ conditions in the certification that EPA incorporates into the final permits.





101 to 401s

- Clean Water Act Section 401 Rule
 - EPA must request certification from our state before issuing their NPDES permit.
 - This helps ensure consistency between federal and state permits in terms of water quality.
- Section 401 rule change initiated by Executive Order in 2019.





- Significant rewrite of Section 401--finalized in September
- Limits states' scope of review, what we can condition on, and other procedural requirements
- Other definitions were changed






- For the "project proponent":
 - Submit pre-filing meeting request at least 30 days prior to the certification request (meetings not required).
 - After we receive a certification request, the request may be withdrawn by the project proponent.
 - If they would like to resubmit, this starts the process from the beginning.





- For the Federal Agency
 - Establish the "reasonable period of time" for how long we have to respond to the certification request—max. 1 year. NPDES requests are still 60 days.
 - Only reviewing compliance with procedural requirements, not whether a decision is within the scope of certification
 - Responsible for enforcing certification conditions
 - Notify neighboring jurisdictions, if applicable






- For the certifying authority (Ecology):
 - Ecology can only condition on point source WQ discharges related to permitted/licensed activity.
 - We can no longer issue reopener clauses or modify certifications once they are issued.
 - Other new procedural requirements.











News from the WQ program

- Recently Completed 401 Certifications:
 - 8 federal dams on lower Columbia and lower Snake (May 2020)
 - Navy Manchester Refueling Station (May 2020)
 - Multi-Sector General Permit (July 2020)
 - Suquamish WWTP Settlement Agreement (November 2020)
- In Progress 401 Certifications:
 - Tribal Enhancement and Federal Research Net Pens General Permit for Puget Sound
- Now offering Government-to-Government consultation

Take Home Messages

- 401 certifications exist so states can ensure federal permits comply with state WQ standards.
- The 2020 401 Rule limits state authority.
 - Changes may come from active lawsuits challenging the rule and/or new administration, but no definitive news yet.
