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Background: The Burnt Bridge Creek watershed is on Washington State's polluted waters list (303d list) for warm water temperatures, bacteria, dissolved oxygen, and pH pollution problems. In October 2020, the Burnt Bridge Creek Source Assessment Report was published to identify critical areas for water quality improvement. The Burnt Bridge Creek Partnership kicked off in February 2021 to develop a TMDL Alternative Restoration Plan for the Burnt Bridge Creek watershed, which is also known as a "Water Cleanup Plan." This plan focuses on identifying priority implementation actions to improve water quality. After the kickoff meeting, the City of Vancouver established implementation workgroups for different priorities in the watershed. The workgroups included Sewer Connection and Septic Systems, <a href="Urban Forestry and Greenways, Stormwater and Capital Improvements, Operations and Maintenance, and Public Education and Outreach. These workgroups met in April and May of 2021. Meeting summaries were sent to each of the workgroups for review.
